

Undergraduate Student Experiences During the COVID-19 Pandemic

In order to understand how students were faring during the rapid changes to instruction and daily life during the COVID-19 pandemic, the Student Affairs Information and Research Office (SAIRO) worked with campus and UC system wide stakeholders to develop questions to be included the University of California Undergraduate Experience Survey (UCUES). This report includes the final summary charts of key content areas that were summarized at various points during the Spring and Summer terms to inform campus decision-making. 
Intent to Return to Campus for Fall 2020







Additional family care responsibilities due to COVID-19





% reporting various levels of confidence in ability



% reporting **compared to in-person classes** how much they have learned



% reporting **compared to in-person classes** how concerned they are about...



% reporting quality of environment compared to in-person classes


